In History

Apr 20, 1915: First half-flight, Australian Flying Corps, sailed for the Baghdad expedition in what was to be the first use of Australian aircraft and crew in war.

Apr 25, 1915: Australian, New Zealand, British and French troops land at Gallipoli. While the campaign was a military failure involving the loss of over 46,000 allied troops, (Turkey lost 65,000) the day is a national day of commemoration in both Australia and New Zealand.

Apr 07, 1916: Australians reach the Western Front. First Australian units of 2nd Division arrived at, and introduced to fighting on the Western Front in a quiet area known as the "nursery sector" around Armentieres, France.

Apr 04, 1918: First action at Villers-Bretonneux. Overlooking the Somme, and within range of Amiens, Villers-Bretonneux was a primary objective in early April when the German Spring offensive was in its dying stages.

Apr 24-25, 1918: Second battle of Villers-Bretonneux, Western Front. Having captured the town three weeks earlier, the Germans were driven out by Australian and British troops in a daring night attack that resulted in 1469 casualties.

The Lara RSL Book and Film Club

The group meets on the 3rd Thursday of the month at the Lara RSL between 10am and 12 midday. Any members or friends can join, although, due to Covid restrictions the group is limited to 10 people.

Each month three books from Goodreads best seller list from the previous twelve months is submitted. The group chooses one book which becomes the book to read for the next month gathering. Only books twelve months old are selected so that only up-to-date books are read.

Members of the group are directed to the cheapest source of purchasing the book, usually an e-book for around \$5, although those desiring a hard copy can obtain it through Geelong local library, if not available, they are directed to the cheapest source to purchase the book.

Time is taken during the meeting to discuss the previous month read and look at choosing the next month read. We also discuss any good movies others have watched on streaming, DVD or the movies.

We currently have a bus trip organised for the 9th of April 2021 to attend Fort



ANZAC DAY Dawn Service - Lara RSL,6AM, 25 April 2021



Please note that in accordance with State Government Covid19 protocols this event may be cancelled at a moment's notice.

To-date we have State Government approval to hold the 'Dawn Service' as a Tier Three Event (up to 1000 people).

We have allocated within our 'boundary' an area we can manage, as our responsibility under Covid19 restrictions, for 400 persons to include Lara RSL members and families, current serving and retired members of the Australian Defence Force and families and invited guests. Should this number not be reached, Lara residents are invited to attend given that they must register on entry (sign in or QR code), socially distance and wear a mask. Other space outside our designated area may be available given larger numbers may be expected.

There is no parking on site (please use the train station car park). There will be limited seating for the elderly and disabled. Wreath presenters are requested to hold their wreaths until called forward to be laid. Portable toilets will be available on site.

At the conclusion of the 'Service' a 'soldier's' tea or coffee together with an ANZAC biscuit will be served free of charge.
