COVID Safe Update

Further to the Victorian Premier's most recent announcement, restrictions were eased across Victoria with effect from 2359 Thursday 18 November 2021. Accordingly, the following applies when visiting Lara RSL:

- Gathering limits, capacity and density limits no longer apply
- Masks are not required.
- Members and their guests are required by the Victorian Government to be double vaccinated and to check in using the available QR code or signing in on the form in the foyer.

In History

Nov 18, 1916: Somme campaign ends after 4 months and more than 1.2 million casualties from both sides.

Nov 03, 1918: Armistice with Austria-Hungary signed.

Nov 19, 1941: HMAS Sydney [II] sunk with the loss of entire crew of 645 under circumstances that remain controversial to this day.

Nov 12, 1943: Last Japanese air raid on Darwin, it was the 64th raid on Australia since February 1942.

Nov 23, 1948: Formation of the Australian Regiment.

Nov 10, 1964: Selective conscription introduced for 20year old males by ballot under the National Service Act. The National Service Scheme saw 15,381 young men serve in Vietnam.

RSL VICTORIA HERE FOR YOU

RSL Victoria is here to provide assistance and support to past and present service personnel and their families.

Importantly you do not have to be a member of the RSL to receive assistance from RSL Victoria; you only have to be a current or former member of the Australian Defence Force, our Allies, or a dependent of either group.

Explore our support services below or contact Veteran Central for direct support.



Veteran Central is a place for Victorian veterans to interact with Ex-Service Organisations and get the support they need to maintain their wellbeing. Our **1300 MILVET** (1300 645 838) number is staffed by Case Navigators who will work directly with you to find and link you to supports that are available. This might be within RSL programs, our Ex-Service Organisation community in Australia, or help navigating the DVA system or Commonwealth aged care system.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Any veteran or family member of a veteran is welcome to speak to us. RSL defines a veteran as anyone who has served within the Australian or an Allied Defence Force, including reservists. We know there are different eligibility criteria for different DVA and ESO services; we can help you navigate these.

COMPENSATION SUPPORT

If you are thinking of submitting a claim to DVA for an injury or illness, we recommend that you use an advocacy service to help the claims process.

HEALTH AND WELLBEING SUPPORT

MENTAL HEALTH INITIATIVE

RSL ACTIVE

<u>RSL Active is a program from RSL Victoria designed to support the physical health and wellbeing of</u> <u>veterans and their families.</u>

Returned Service Personnel Parking Permits

If you have served Australia in Active Military Service you may be eligible for a Returned Service Personnel Parking Permit.

Council has adopted a parking permit system to acknowledge the people who have served Australia in active military service in recognition of such service.

The parking permit waives any fees associated with parking in Central Geelong. The permit holder is still required to adhere to the applicable time limits.

Returned Service Personnel Parking Permits are:

- Issued to current City of Greater Geelong residents who have served Australia in active military service in the theatre of war recognised by the Department of Veterans Affairs.
- For the purpose of the scheme active military service be defined as that of being involved in the theatre of war, which is recognized by;
 - Australian Acting Service Medal 1939-1945
 - Australian Active Service Medal 1945-1975
 - Australian Active Service Medal 1975 onward
 - Veteran's Affairs Gold Card includes War Widow's Gold Card

The following proof of eligible criteria is required:

- Presentation of medals or Gold Card for verification when lodging application
- Drivers License/Photo ID
- VicRoads vehicle registration certificate/s
- Proof of residency in City of Greater Geelong (that is: rates notice, utility bill)
