From the President

Hello everyone. Following our most recent Committee meeting on 7 July 2020 we have decided in line with the almost hourly changes that the Government make with relation to COVID 19 that we will continue to monitor our planned opening and return to 'business' on a

monthly basis. Given that before the most recent return to lock down for Melbourne, we were expecting to open when the 'gathering of up to 50 people in an establishment' was scheduled for 11 July. In considering our options we looked at the myriad of 'regulations and requirements' provided by the Government through RSL HQ and the Council covering sanitation, hygiene, cleaning, handling of cash, numbers of patrons and social distancing etc and given our aged membership, medical issues, space available and the number of 'volunteers' required to manage an opening we felt that the risks in opening are at this stage too great. Notwithstanding, your Committee will be determining the way ahead for the future and we will open when it is safe to do so. Confused, so are we but rest assured we are working to the best of our abilities to open up again taking care that everyone will be safe.

Because of our forced closure and uncertainty of reopening we have decided to sell the remaining bar stock which is about half way through its shelf life. The stock will be sold at discount prices, see page 2 for further details.

As a result of the resignations of our Bar Manager and Assistant Bar Manager earlier this year we have now appointed Ron Collins and Hanna Millar to these two positions as part of their Committee responsibilities. When you see them next please welcome them to their positions and remember this 'club' works best through the help of all of its members.

We have again had some success in the grants funding with Bendigo Bank providing \$5800 for our 'artificial grass' makeover of our outdoor entertaining area, and the Federal Government providing \$1500 for supplies to maintain our Museum collection.

Our solar panel installation is working well in our favour with the last electricity account well down, although the big fridge hasn't been running for awhile, but nevertheless we estimate that the panels have halved our annual energy costs.

In light of our closedown and inactivity this year the Committee have decided to cut the annual subscription fee by 50% to \$20 when fees for 2021 fall due.

The Committee has also decided that our December Christmas lunch will be held at the RSL. We are still to look for a suitable caterer but it will be in 'buffet' format with sufficient tables and chairs for those who wish to sit down to eat. We will also be looking to utilize the outdoor area given its proposed makeover. This is subject to change in line with COVID-19.

In History

Jul 31, 1914: Labour Leader Andrew Fisher declares, Australians will defend Britain "to our last man and our last shilling". Little did he or could he have imagined the extent of Australia's sacrifice in WW1.

Jul 1, 1916: First day of the battle of the Somme.

Jul 19, 1916: Battle of Fromelles. In the first battle for Australians on the Western Front, 5,533 were killed or wounded on the night of 19-20 July.

Jul 22, 1938: Australian National War Memorial Museum opened at Villers-Bretonneux, France. This memorial lists the names of 11,000 Australians missing from fighting around Villers-Bretnoneux.

Jul 1, 1942: Sinking of the Montevideo Maru by USS Sturgeon, an American Submarine. Australia's worst maritime disaster, it carried 1050 Australian prisoners captured on New Britain and New Ireland, none of whom survived.

Jul 27, 1942: Japanese capture Kokoda in an attempt to reach Port Moresby having been stopped in their attempt to do so by sea.

Jul 2, 1950: No. 77 Squadron flies first combat mission in Korea.


