

Good turnout for the first ladies afternoon.







Les was born in Geelong to descendants from Ireland, his dad Ronald Patrick and his grandfather Patrick Augustus. Les grew up in Marcus Hill (Bellarine Peninsula) and, with no power back in those days, it was kerosene lights at the table.

The farm that Les's Dad managed was shared with his Mum Marjorie, his three sisters being Ilma, Joyce, Gail and three brothers being Bill, Wal (Walter) and his twin brother Bob. But there were others that had better conditions on the property.

Back down on the lower part of the farm the livestock were just fine, they had town water at their troughs while a mile and a half back up at the farm house there was no running water. Les remembers his family members hand pumping the water from the underground tanks up to the overhead tank, this would then gravity feed to the taps. The town water pipe ran through the lower part of the farm which was over a mile away and it wasn't until Les was 12 years old that his family acquired running water to the house.

Twin brother Robert (Bob), Wesley Gordon Smith AKA Mick a plumber (Uncle) and Les.

Les also remembers his mum boiling all the clothes, no washing machine in sight. This would require many boiling kettles and a pot stick to stir and push down the clothes.

Not only was there a town water pipe running through the property but there was also the Queenscliff/Geelong rail line which cut right through the middle of the property.

The rail line was in place first and to run the water pipe under the rail line was a big deal back in the day. The method used was to blast jets of water under the rail line which would be inspected by the V-Line equivalent at the time. The inspection was to make sure that not too much foundation had been blasted away.

The rail line was fenced off with a gate on either side, this meant moving cattle from the top paddocks to the bottom and vice versa required a bit of fiddling around.

Les left Marcus Hill when he was 16 years old, this was when his dad Ronald passed away at the age of 54 years old. Les along with the rest of his family moved into Geelong, Les didn't like it at all. It wasn't all bad, Les went to the dance hall in Leopold where he met a young lass by the name of Jennifer King, Jennifer and Les were both 16 years old and exactly 2 months apart, Les's birthday in Feb and Jennifer's in Apr, this meeting would prove to be pivotal.

In **1961 at the age of 12 years old** Les was attending Geelong Junior Technical School (Moorabool St) for 4 years completing Form 4 and receiving his indenture to be gainfully employed as an apprentice Plumber with C.E. & I Bramham Plumbing & Gas Fitting, where at the end of his 4-year apprenticeship he was fully qualified. Also, in the same year Les joined the Mannerim Fire Brigade (Bellarine Peninsula) which is still spanning a lengthy career to this day in the CFA. The following year Les transferred over to the Geelong City Fire Brigade.

All Saints Church, Newtown Geelong

1965 was a busy year for Les, fully **qualified as a plumber** joined the **Freemasons** and now **married** to the girl he saw at the Leopold Dance Hall 4 years earlier.

1968 was the move to Lara, Jennifer and Les Built a Home in Banks St in June.

1969 Lara Fires

1969 Les now transfers over to the Lara Fire Brigade only to witness what would be a catastrophic year for some. Perfect conditions for a total fire ban brought **fires that devastated Lara** and the surrounding districts. On the 8th January on a total fire ban day 230 fires burnt more than 324,00 hectares. Twenty-one of these fires were highly destructive with the worst occurring on the urban fringe of Melbourne.

A fire at Anakie near the Geelong-Ballan Road which had been extinguished the previous day flared up again and moved quickly towards Lara where it **destroyed** a 90-year-old gothic church and **40 houses.** The

worst death toll occurred when a fast-moving grass fire approached the four-lane Melbourne-Geelong Expressway at Lara. **Seventeen people died** when they left their cars and, in the dense smoke, tried to outrun the fire. **Six people who sheltered in their cars survived.**

The event was a catalyst in changing guidelines recommending people are safer staying in a car when the fire is upon them. The fires burnt to the edge of suburban Melbourne affecting Altona, Diamond Valley and Kangaroo Ground. In total **23 people died**, **100 were injured**, and **230 homes and 21 buildings were destroyed**.

On this infamous day Jenny wanted some things at the shops so Les went down around 9.00am to buy these items. It was at this time that the fire got away from the Bacchus Marsh Road area. **Les didn't make it home** until approx. 6.00pm that evening. Jenny was worried about Les; Les was worried about Jenny (pre–Mobile Phone days).

Jenny was smart enough to pack what she could fit in a basket and with the dog Kim headed to the local pool. (As Les is showing me his wedding album, he is pointing out what looks like brown burn marks on the album).

Les then went on to say that there is a big sign on the freeway near the airport, which is near

Beach Road, that is where all the people died in the Freeway fire. There was a lady who lived opposite Lara Lake Primary School who wouldn't leave her home, she also became a **fatality of the fires**.

Les also spoke of occasions when he has been on the back of a fire truck and the heat was so intense that it has **peeled the paint off of the Truck**. One thing Les has requested is **not to be cremated**.

On the Move



The opening of the Lara Museum and Historical Centre is a story about community spirit. Through the passion of the Lara residents to preserve and celebrate the town's history, the Lara Museum and Historical Centre on the corner of Forrest Rd South and Canterbury Road West, was officially opened on the 18th April 2013.

Its opening was the culmination of more than three years of planning and hard work by the people of Lara, Lino Bisinella and the rest of the team at Bisinella Developments. The project also demonstrated what can be achieved when residents and business work together for the common good. Long time Lara residents and friends, Ian Board and Les Kelly had often discussed the need to preserve Lara's history, and the lack of any facility to collect historical material and make it readily accessible to the public.

In mid-2011. Ian and Les heard that the former **Lake Bank Hotel** property had been sold to Lino Bisinella, managing director of Bisinella Developments. The Lake Bank is Lara's only surviving 19th century hotel. One of Laras oldest buildings, it was constructed in 1860 for Scottish immigrant James Henderson and operated as a licensed hotel until 1908.

The distinctive limestone buildings were home to five generations of Mr Henderson's family. The property had been sold to Lino by James Henderson's great grandson Jack and his wife Brenda Darcy. Ian and Les approached Lino about the possibility of using the historical building as a community museum. Lino quickly gave Ian and Les his commitment that, provided they could muster sufficient community enthusiasm and support, he would fully renovate the historic buildings at his own cost and allow them to use these facilities for their purpose.

A public meeting was held in September 2011 to gauge public interest and a provisional committee of eight was elected to start work. The Lara Heritage and Historical Inc was incorporated on January 12th 2012. Lino set about personally overseeing every single detail of the somewhat challenging renovation project. It was very much a labour of love. The building was lovingly restored and refurbished at a cost to Lino of about \$500,000. He then leased the property for \$1 a year to the local community group formed to operate the museum.

Ian, Les and their members worked closely with Lino and the Bisinella team throughout the renovation project. At the same time, they started the process of collecting historical information and items from the community. Since it opened, memorabilia and items of historic interest have continued to be loaned or donated to the museum, bringing local history to life in the ideal setting of the limestone buildings.

The Lara Museum and Historical Centre is open to the public from 11.00am to 4.00pm on Wednesdays and Sundays. Group bookings are available by appointment. <u>www.laramuseum.org.au</u>
